2022 was an exciting year for Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Bruce North Huron involving measured outcomes resulting in deeper impacts.

From Dr. Nadine Burke Harris's promotion of consistent caring adults preventing the negative effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) to the establishment of the Canadian Mentoring Partnership, the importance of mentoring is being recognized now more than ever.

In 2022, BBBSSBNH continued to broaden our impact to serve more communities with our School Based Mentoring program thanks to a grant from the United Way Perth Huron. We had the opportunity to empower more young people in numerous schools across Northern Huron County; we will continue these efforts in 2023. BBBSSBNH also had a stronger presence in the Bluewater District School Board by offering our school based program in more schools.

It is clear from a growing body of evidence that in order for children and youth to thrive, they require more intentional, prolonged exposure to developmental assets. Within 5 months of being matched, our Mentors, Parents and Teachers are reporting noticeable results with an increase in self confidence, increase in cooperation, increase in responsibility, improved peer relationships and more class participation. Because of this, BBBSSBNH continues our goal of serving children and youth with more adversities.

During the summer of 2022, we extended our group program and thanks to generous donors, we were able to take our Littles to a Jay's Game - for many this was their first time ever! Our summer was packed full of adventures through our area.

I am profoundly grateful to our volunteers, donors and community for continuing to support BBBSSBNH's mission of building thriving communities by empowering lives through mentorship. In 2023, we will continue our work, deviating young people from risk taking behaviours and expanding possibilities so that they can have a brighter future.

What we learned in 2022

■ Stable Caring Adults Can Mitigate the Impact of Childhood Trauma

In 2022, BBBSSBNH found that our Littles have had an average of 3-5 Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). Assessing adversity is one component of BBBSSBNH's complex prioritization process.

■ Children & Youth Need Our Support

The children & youth in our programs are part of Generation Z. This Generation is the most connected, yet, they self-report as feeling the most isolated and lonely. We are still experiencing the effects of COVID - lack of socialization, inconsistent and disrupted learning, and an increase in mental health crises.

What are ACEs?

Adverse Childhood Experiences

ACES are potentially traumatic events that can occur between 0-17 (CDC, 2019). Without supportive adults, they can lead to toxic stress in a child's body. The more ACEs a child experiences, the more likely he or she is to suffer from things like heart disease and diabetes, poor academic achievement, and substance abuse later in life (Centre on Developing Disease, Harvard).

Some examples include:

- Physical and Emotional Abuse
- Neglect
- Caregiver Mental Illness
- Household Violence



Measuring Our Impact

Evidence that Mentoring Leads to Major Impacts on a Child's Life

Thriving Indicators

In 2022 BBBSSBNH collected evidence of our impact through the Search Institute's 40 Developmental Assets Framework. Developmental Assets are collected in the perspective of the child upon entering, and then collected annually to measure assets that have landed.

The depth of BBBSSBNH's intervention leads to life changing impacts on the young person, their family and the communities they live in.



Building assets to thrive requires a consistent caring adult being in a young person's corner over a significant period of time.
